Changing technology landscape in education

- Online testing
- More subjects have technology integrated

KSHS recommendations

- Wi-Fi 5Ghz
- 10" or larger screen size
- 8GB RAM
- 128GB HDD/SSD
- 5+ hours battery life
- Active pen and keyboard

Portal, retail and second-hand computers

- Portal has select computers (Surface Pro 7+ and Go 3)
- Minor item and bundle cost differences
- Different price and warranty (portal vs retail)

Computer configuration

- Student should be a local administrator
- Ensure Windows is not running in S mode
- Install Windows Updates

Computer protection

- Physical: rugged cases
- Digital: anti-virus software
 - Free
 - Paid

Windows, MacOS, iPadOS, Android and ChromeOS

- Suitability
- Local vs cloud storage
- Application compatibility (for example: Office, NAPLAN)
- Office local and Office Online

- Do I have to use the Education version of Microsoft 365 (formerly Office 365)?
- No. If you have a paid subscription you can use this instead. If using a paid subscription, please check OneNote is included as OneNote is used in the school, but isn't included in some subscriptions.

- How do I change the version of Microsoft 365 installed from a paid subscription to the Education version?
- The subscription version must be uninstalled first, then the Education version installed. This requirement is due to Microsoft 365 licensing.

- Do students have access to OneDrive and if so, how much storage space do they have?
- Yes, students have access to OneDrive. They have a 200GB limit.

- Is Google Chrome used in the school given recent security concerns?
